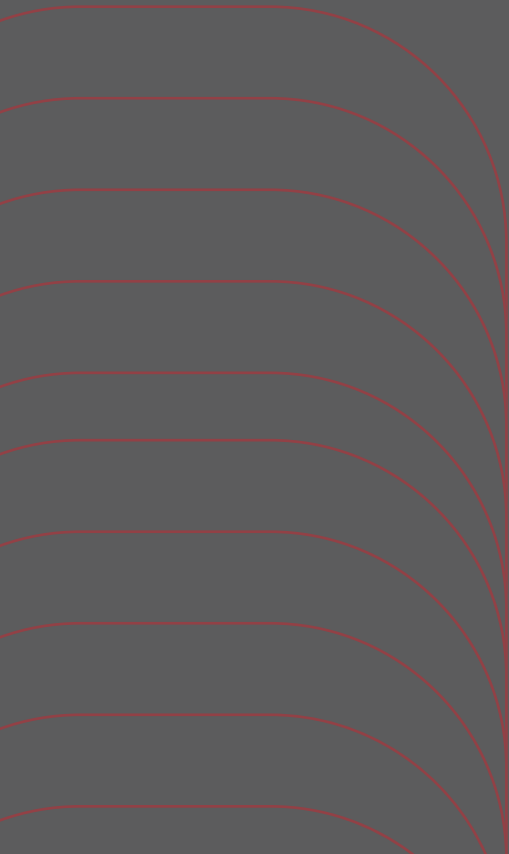


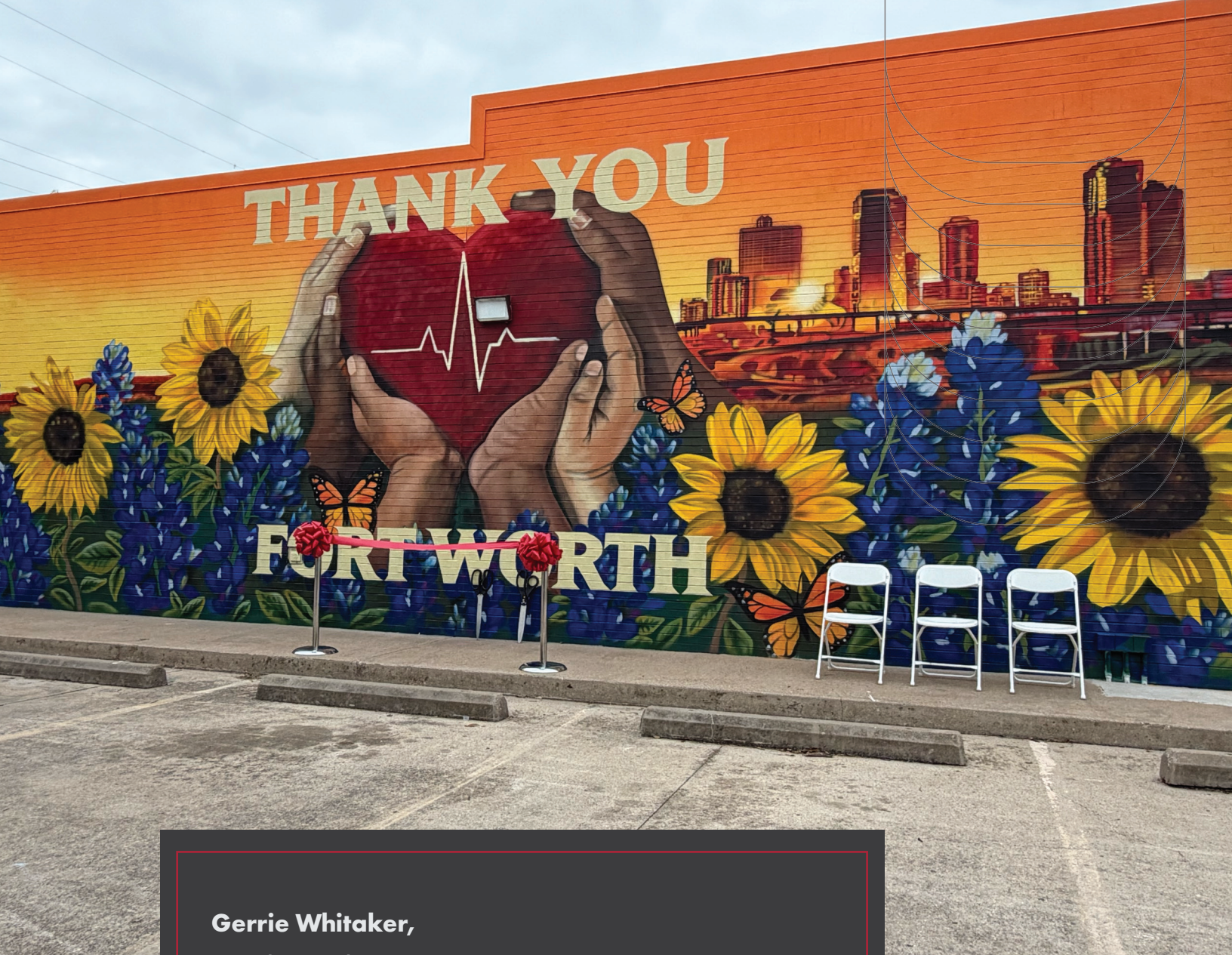

Joyful Beginnings is a special program for NTACHC's moms-to-be and families. Becoming a mother is a big change, and NTACHC helps during this time.

- One-on-one sessions with caring professionals

NTACHC Trains Baylor Scott & White All Saints Residents

NTACHC has partnered with Baylor Scott & White All Saints to train its OB/GYN residents to get real world clinical experience to deepen their understanding of community health. Through working with our providers who model caring and compassionate healthcare, these residents are learning "on the job" while helping to care for patients.



Here are some of their stories:

"I was able to see a patient regularly as an antepartum. I was unable to be there for her delivery, but I did see her for several visits postpartum. Being able to take care of patients through the different stages of pregnancy is amazing and reassuring them with someone she already trusts, which makes a huge difference."

"I was able to see a patient in the emergency department and told her about her positive pregnancy test. Then I saw her for her first clinic visit to establish care!"

"A patient had a cesarean section for her first delivery and highly desired a vaginal delivery, if possible. She was able to have a TOLAC induction with a vaginal delivery and was so thankful for the resident team for their help."

Rocki's Closet

Rocki's Closet allows the Joyful Beginnings families to earn while they learn. Access to the closet is a benefit reserved for actively enrolled participants.

These participants attend classes on parenting and other related topics in order to earn Rocki Bucks. They can then use these bucks for diapers, nursery gear, formula, clothing and more!

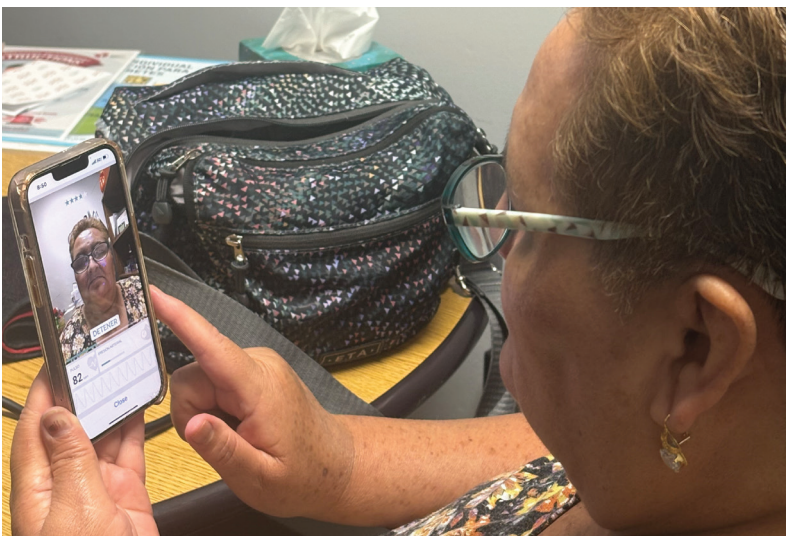
NTACHC's Living Your Best Life Program Celebrates Five Years of Success in Diabetes and Hypertension Management

NTACHC's Living Your Best Life Program (LYBL) has helped patients manage diabetes and high blood pressure. LYBL has demonstrated exceptional results in controlling hypertension through innovative strategies and dedicated care to address diverse patient needs.

Since joining in 2020, NTACHC has expanded its efforts by participating in the National Hypertension Control Initiative (NHCI), a collaborative project led by the American Heart Association and HRSA. This partnership enabled NTACHC to incorporate remote patient monitoring (RPM) into the LYBL program. Utilizing Bluetooth-enabled blood pressure monitors, RPM has proven to be a game-changer for patients with uncontrolled hypertension.

- 80% of patients enrolled in RPM are now managing their blood pressure effectively.
- More than 350 patients actively engaged in RPM.
- 1,170+ have benefited from LYBL since its launch.

This remarkable achievement demonstrates the effectiveness of RPM in enhancing patient outcomes and underscores NTACHC's dedication to patient-centered care.



LYBL Recognition

NTACHC was featured in the NHCI Data Integration Roadmap shared by HRSA. This recognition highlights NTACHC's role as a model for other health centers seeking to implement RPM and enhance health outcomes across the country.

LYBL also achieved a significant milestone of accreditation by the Association of Diabetes Care & Education Specialists.
